Serving as a Volunteer in a Typical Small Appalachian Church

(Key things to know and to do)

- 1. **Get to know before you go!** (What is the church's story?)
- 2. **Build relationships with key leaders.** (Let them help do the event.)
- 3. **Make the event a family celebration.** (Put the heart on the same level with the head.)
- 4. **Less is more—sometimes.** (Thrift is a staple element.)
- 5. **Know to whom you speak!** (Sell to the right person.)
- 6. **Appreciate the small or rural church.** (They are our roots.)
- 7. **Let the church know you.** (Who will they meet when you arrive?)
- 8. **Be practical with your knowledge.** (Share successful experiences that relate to them.)
- 9. Integrate teaching and learning with their concerns. (Listen—then teach.)
- 10. Remember "small churches" carry a prejudice in our culture. (No paternalism.)
- 11. Create a hunger for your resources. (Meet needs—then suggest resources.)
- 12. Be passive-aggressive to get into the churches. (Baptists like independence.)
- 13. **Watch the hatchets.** (Rivalries spill over into the church.)
- 14. **Family is more important than education.** (People; "who" is more important than "what.")
- 15. **Resistance is very present.** (Oldest organization in the community.)
- 16. **Become part of Sunday School through adoption, not membership.** (Join a larger church; are adopted into a smaller church.)
- 17. **Must have options to pick and choose.** (Resistant to simply "you ought to.")
- 18. **Limited resources perception.** ("We cannot afford it.")
